### Benefits of CSS3 (besides looking cool)

#### Decrease

development time maintenance time page loading time

#### Increase

usability
accessibility
adaptability across devices
search engine placement

## Reduced development and maintenance time

- Less images, Flash, JavaScript
- Streamlined markup

## Increased page performance

- Smaller file sizes
- Fewer HTTP requests

Reducing the number of HTTP requests...is the most important guideline for improving performance for first time visitors.

## Better search engine placement

- Google uses speed as ranking factor
- Real text instead of image or Flash text
